**COMMUNITY SERVICE ORDER**

WHEREAS this day on the 31<sup>st</sup> August 2023, Mrs Siu Yi Annick HOW TUE (the convicted person') was convicted before me for the offence of corruption of agent in breach of sections 16(1) & 83 of the Prevention of Corruption Act 2002 (POCA) under two counts of the Information. The convicted person was sentenced to undergo a **concurrent term of imprisonment of 3 months under each count and 500 rupees for costs.**

WHEREAS after considering a report from the Probation Office, I am satisfied that the convicted person is a suitable person to be the subject of a community service order.

WHEREAS I have explained to the convicted person, in Court:

- a) the purpose, effect and duration of the order;
- b) the hereunder mentioned conditions attached to the order and the consequences of a breach of any condition;
- c) that the court may amend the order on application made by the convicted person or a community service order;

- d) that any breach of the Act or any condition of the community service order renders him liable to -
- (i) without prejudice to the continuance of the order, a fine not exceeding 10,000 rupees;
  - (ii) a revocation of the order; or
  - (iii) an amendment of the order.

WHEREAS I have ascertained that:

- a) the convicted person gives her consent to the making of the order.
- b) adequate arrangements have been made for the carrying into effect of the order.

I THEREFORE SUSPEND the sentence of imprisonment on the convicted person and make a community service order requiring the convicted person to perform unpaid work in the open for 90 hours subject to the following conditions:

- a) work shall commence on the **7<sup>th</sup> October 2023**.
- b) work must be performed for **90 hours on Saturdays and Sundays at Sodnac Police Station from 0800 and 1600 hours**.
- c) the convicted person must reside at **C3 Cloverfield Residence, Dumat Street, Beau Bassin**.
- d) the convicted person must be under the supervision of a community service officer, or any other community service officer designated by the commissioner of the Mauritius Probation and Aftercare Service;
- e) the convicted person shall be of good conduct, shall not disturb the public peace and shall avoid contact with the victim of the offence of which he was convicted;
- f) the convicted person shall abstain from using an offensive weapon;
- g) the convicted person shall meet the needs of his dependents;
- h) the work shall be performed diligently and at reasonable speed;
- i) the convicted person shall make his own arrangements, financial or otherwise, to attend his site of work.
- j) The convicted person shall be subject to **counselling** for half an hour sessions on a monthly basis on the last Thursdays at Rose Hill Probation Office, starting on **26<sup>th</sup> October 2023 at 1430**.

I FURHER ORDER that the convicted person appears in court on the 27-11-23  
on which day the case is scheduled Pro Forma for a follow up report.
